





Individual Orientation Program	Students meet for an individual counseling session with their counselor. The purpose this initial meeting is to provide the counselor with an opportunity to get to know each student on a personal level and for the student to become familiar with the high school counseling program.
Group Orientation Program	Small group orientation sessions take place in September. At these meetings the students are provided with a 9 th grade orientation guide which focuses on themes common to all, i.e., graduation requirements, honor society requirements, etc.
Ongoing Academic Monitoring	The counselors review all progress reports and report cards to determine the need for intervention. When necessary, appointments are scheduled between the counselor and students. Parent/Guardian involvement is scheduled when necessary.
Student/Parent Counselor Conference	Counselors meet with each student and his/her parents/guardians during the third and fourth quarters of the school year to review the student's academic and personal progress and make recommendations for the 10 th grade. Among other topics, at this time the counselor will discuss issues related to standardized testing, including the PSAT.



Manhasset High School--English as a New Language Program (ENL)

Questionnaire	Students who are enrolled in a New York State school for the first time and are exposed to a language other than English in their homes are required to take the NYSITELL (New York State Identification Test for English Language Learners).

The score on the NYSITELL determines the number of periods of ENL that will be required. Students who demonstrate difficulty with English (as determined by their score on the **English as a New Language** NYSITELL) will be scheduled for ENL. They may be required to take from one to three (ENL) Requirements periods of ENL per day.

The NYSESLAT (New York State English as a Second Language Achievement Test) is an **NYSESLAT** receive services for two years.
