## Manhasset's Magic "Collaboration"




- Education plans are individualized based on student needs

- Programs and services provided in Least Restrictive Environment (LRE)
- Home/school communication and connection
- Annual Review of students progress
- Inclusive of all departments
- Teachers are dually certified





## Budget Developed to Serve 460 Students With Disabilities (SWD)



### **Preschool**

#### Ages 3-5

- District facilitates evaluation and Committee on Preschool Special Education (CPSE) meetings
- 60 day timeline (including summer)
- Students found eligible based on delay in developmental milestones
- Only one classification Preschooler with a Disability
- Continuum of services provided by Nassau County approved providers
- 5 year student average is 27







## **School Age**

### Ages 5 - 21 years

- ❖ Referrals by CPSE, Instructional Support Team (IST), other professionals when appropriate, or Parent/Guardian
- 60 day timeline (including summer)
- Eligible based on variety of sources (aptitude & achievement tests, parent input, student's physical, social or cultural background, and adaptive behavior)
- Thirteen classifications/disabilities
- Continuum of Services provided by District












## High School Diplomas June 2021: 33 SWDs


## Yearly Comparison of Special Education Budget Percentage Change
